

FSU Golf Team Bows to Mercer In Close Match

Mercer university's experienced golf team barely edged their way past Florida State University's Seminole shotmakers 9½-8½ at the Country Club course yesterday afternoon.

Golf Coach Ed Burleson of FSU commented that he was especially pleased with the play of Eddie Andrews, stocky Tallahasseean who captains the Seminole linksmen. He said "Andrews is a very good captain and a very good golfer."

The local boy turned in the best card for the afternoon when he shot a two-over-par 74 as he swept past Mercer's Sam Glassman in individual match play by a three-up margin. Andrews also teamed with Hank Mercer in the foursome play to down Mercer University's team of Jack Morgan and Glassman, by a three-up count.

Morgan Unbeaten

Morgan, playing from Mercer's number one position, kept his undefeated intercollegiate record intact as he edged past Hank Mercer of State 2 and 1 in the first match of the afternoon. Both men turned in cards of 75.

Sonny Tinney, regular for FSU, was absent from the matches while participating in the final round of the Florida Intercollegiate meet at DeLand against Pete Dye of Stetson.
