

Victorious in their season opener against the University of Georgia, Florida State University's golf squad was scheduled to start matching strokes with Florida's leading college linksmen in the annual state intercollegiate golf tourney in DeLand.

The Seminoles fashioned a narrow 14-13 triumph over the Bulldogs over the Country club course yesterday afternoon in a match played in a steady rain.

FSU scored an identical 14-13 triumph last year under similar conditions.

Sub Comes Through

Bill Rice, a last-minute substitution who didn't make the trip to DeLand, was the key man in the Indians' win over Georgia. Taking over for Sonny Tinney who is reported to have been injured in a recent surfboard accident, Rice fired a 77 that won three vital points from the Bulldogs' Buzz Lee. In team scoring Rice paired with Bob Rollett to win another point from the Bulldogs' duo of Art Gunter and Lee.

Ted Hewitt, all-around Seminole athletic ace, paced the field yesterday with a out-over par 73 that gave him the medal honors for the day. The Indians' Joe Bassett was runnerup with a 74, while Georgia's Hal Spears was low for the Red and Black with a 75.
