

MATCH PLAY AT DELAND

College Golf Field To Be Cut to Eight

DELAND, (AP)—Two rounds of match play were scheduled today in the Florida intercollegiate golf tournament to cut the field to eight quarter-finalists.

Bill Fernandez of the University of Florida and Cotton Bradley of Florida Southern college tied for medal honors with even par 144 over 36 holes in yesterday's qualifying round. Fernandez won a playoff.

Grace Lenczyk, former women's amateur champion gave a coeducational touch, squeezing in the championship flight along with 31 boys. She had to beat out three male entrants in a playoff after each shot 155.

Rollins Team Wins

Team honors went to Rollins college, the four players scoring 593 to edge Miami by a stroke over the 6,240-yard college arms course.

Two rounds of match play also are scheduled tomorrow. The finalists will play a 36-hole match for the individual title Saturday.

Florida State University, which tied for fifth place in the team scoring, paced three men in the championship flight. The Seminoles seeking the title are Jim James, Ted Hewitt and Dick Montney.

James paced the FSU contingent with a 36-hole qualifying score of 147. Hewitt had 150 and Montney 151. The other two Indian shotmakers failed to make the select group.

Art Severson Advances In College Golf

DELAND, March 23.—(P)—Defending champ Art Severson, the methodical Miami junior, brushed aside first and second round opposition in the Florida intercollegiate golf tourney today.

The 25-year-old Madison, Wis., golfer wasn't pressed as he outstroked Billy Key of Rollins and Jim James of Florida State by identical 3 and 2 scores.

Severson takes on Bob Keller in the quarter-finals tomorrow in an all-Miami match. Keller advanced by beating Jim Yancey of Florida, 2 and 1, and Larry Doyle of Miami, 6 and 5.

Florida's Bill Hernandez, tournament medalist, moved ahead by downing Ted Hewitt of FSU, 6 and 4, and Tim Holland of Miami, 1 up on the 19th.

Other championship flight results included: Frank Harned of Miami beat Jim Brass of Rollins, 4 and 3, and Cotton Bradley of Florida Southern, 3 and 2; Joe Bryan of Florida beat Jay Rotan of Stetson, 1 up, and Tom Bailey of Florida, 1 up.

Jim Thomas of Miami beat Dick Davis of St. Petersburg Junior College, 3 and 2, and Dick Montney of FSU, 3 and 1. Jupe Arnold of Rollins beat Al Rossiter of Florida, 4 and 3, and Bill O'Hara of Southern, 2 and 1.

Tommy Sullivan of Miami beat Grace Lenczyk of Stetson, 2 and 1, and Ted Kuzma of Miami, 5 and 4.
