

Playing without the services of Ted Hewitt and Tom Cumbie, the Florida State University Seminoles dropped a golf match to the Jacksonville Naval Air Station here yesterday afternoon, 17½ to 9½. The loss was Florida State's first of the season. The Seminoles have won two matches and tied one.

Bill Faulk of Navy with a two-under-par 70 came up with the best medal score of the afternoon to defeat Dick Montney, Florida State ace, three points to none. Bud Marsee's fine 73 was low medal for the Seminoles.
