Billy Maxwell's Record 278 Wins Crown

ATHENS. Ga. May 12, (P)— Little Billy Maxwell of North Texas State College trimmed 10 strokes off par to win the Southern intercollegiate golf champlonship today with a record-breaking 278.

The amazing Maxwell, whose first round 65 also was a record, shot his poorest round of the meet on the final 18 holes—a par 72—but he was far ahead of the field. His four round scores were 65-70-71-72—278.

Ten strokes behind Maxwell and even with par was Griffin Moody of the University of Georgia, the runnerup. He shot 71-70-73-74—288. This gave Moody the Southeastern conference golf title.

Maxwell's 278 shaved two strokes off the previous Southern intercollegiate golf record set last year by Arnold Palmer of Wake Forest.

Only three shotmakers were able to shave anything off the Athens Country club's 36-36—72 par in the final round. Don January of North Texas State pared thrus strokes with a 69 and Buster Reed, also of North Texas, and Billy Key of Rollins had 71's.

In winning the Southeastern conference title, which is decided along with the Southern, Moody was nine strokes alread of Florda's Dan Sikes who finished with a 297.

Florida State University's Dick Montney and Eddie Johnson finished in a tie for 11th place with 2988 Montney had a 72-74-78-74. Johnson carded a 76-70-76-76

Two other FSU golfers, Tommy Brown and Tom Cumble, wound up with a 318 and 323 respectively.
