WINTER PARK — Beaten in their opening match with Jacksonville Navy yesterday, Florida State University's golf team was looking for its first win of the season here today against the Rollins Tars.

Today's match is the second of a three-meet tour for the Seminoles. Saturday they move over to DeLand to play the Stetson Hatters.

The DeLand course is the site of the Florida Intercollegiate tourney on March 20-22, and the Seminoles' scores will be watched closely on that layout tomorrow as an indication of the bid they will make for the state crown next week.

One of the Seminole stars, Robert "Sonny" Tinney, copped the state college crown back in 1948.

High winds and rain sent scores up in Jacksonville yesterday as the Seminoles bowed to the Fliers 9½ to 8½.

Tinney, warming up for another college title bid, paced the FSU shotmakers with a 73. Tinney and Erwin Scott of Jax Navy were the only two players able to break 75 under the handicap of the poor golfing weather.

Tinney and James (FSU) tied Foulk and Scott 1½ to 1½; Brown and Cumble (FSU) defeated Wallace and Pearson 2 to 1.
