

Frank Hirt, tall Tallahasseean, who is a member of the Florida State University golf team, is thinking of asking Coach Bob Harbison to "have mercy" and move him into the number one position for future matches.

Hirt, who has been playing in the fifth or sixth slot in Seminole matches this season, ran into another human buzz saw here yesterday afternoon when Bob Lowry of the Citadel threw a six under par 66 at him to pace the Bulldogs to a 21-6 victory over Florida State. Hirt and Lowry, who the Citadel coach said hadn't broken 80 in earlier matches this season, were playing in the six position yesterday.

Tuesday afternoon, in his last previous start, Hirt's opponent was Troy Smith of Georgia who posted a 69.

Florida State was able to gain only two ties in the nine matches here yesterday as Citadel swept to its easy win. The Seminoles were playing without the services of star Sonny Tinney, state intercollegiate champ, who is participating in the state amateur tournament at Jacksonville.

Other matches on the Florida State golf schedule here this week will be against Rollins College Thursday afternoon and Mercer University Saturday morning. The Seminole linksmen have now won three and lost three.
