

Florida State University's Seminole golf team—making its first start in more than three weeks—snapped a two-match losing skid at the Tallahassee Country Club yesterday, turning back the Rollins College Tars, 14½ to 12½.

The dual match triumph, second of the season for the Seminoles over the Tars, was FSU's fifth against three losses.

Capt. Jimmy James led the six-man Seminole shot-makers yesterday, carding a one-under-par 71 to tie Rollins' Bill Boggess, who paired a fine 32 on the back nine with an outgoing 39, for medal honors.

Bobby Harwood, No. 2 on the FSU links ladder, matched par 72.

Dr. Don Veller's Seminoles will make their next-to-last home appearance of the season here Friday, when they entertain Western Illinois State in their only session of the week.

After meeting Coach Howard Wilson's touring Macomb, Ill., Leathernecks here, the Seminoles will play Georgia and Auburn next week in tune-up matches for the Southern Intercollegiate meet, scheduled for Athens, Ga., April 30—May 1-2.
