

FSU GOLFERS NEED RALLY

Seminole Scores Soar at Athens

ATHENS, Ga.—Florida State University's golfers were hoping today to stage a comeback in the Southern Intercollegiate tournament after watching their scores soar yesterday.

Big Frank Hirt paced FSU's individual scores on opening day yesterday with a nine-over-par 81 on the water-logged course. Other Seminole scores were: Jimmy James, 41-41—82; Bob Harwood, 39-43—82; Rudy Boyd, 41-41—82; John Ayres, 44-39—83; Randy Church, 49-41—90; Hirt, 37-44—81.

FSU's four-man team, of course, fell well back in the pack.

Despite day-long downpours, Conrad shot one of the finest rounds yesterday ever turned in over the 6,554-yard, par 36-36—72 Athens Country Club course. He had six birdies, and barely missed getting two eagles. He was over-par on two holes.

His four-under-par round gave him a two-stroke lead over teammate Don January, who had a 70. At third with a 71 was Hillman Robbins of Memphis State, who tied for runnerup last year.

Thirty colleges and universities are represented in the tournament, second only to the national intercollegiate in college play.

North Texas State Wins Intercollegiate Golf Title

ATHENS, Ga. — (AP) — North Texas State won its third straight Southern Intercollegiate Golf Team Championship yesterday, and Stan Mosel of N. T. S. and Eddie Merrins of Louisiana State moved into the lead for individual honors.

The four low N. T. S. players had a combined 36 - hole total of 577, nine strokes under runner-up L. S. U., which captured the Southeastern Conference team title.

The Southern Intercollegiate and SEC Championship are held concurrently each year.

Merrins, former National Jaycee Junior Champion, shot a two under par 70 yesterday for a mid-way total of 142. Mosel, 1950 Texas State champ, matched par with a 36-36—72 to go with his first round 70.
