

DELAND, March 13—University of Florida golfer Pat Schwab won the 72-hole Florida intercollegiate golf tournament here today with a spectacular 22-under-par 266 as the Gators swept the first three team places.

Schwab, under regulation figures in all four tournament rounds, finished ahead of Florida State's Bunk Berry.

Berry, a freshman standout from Tallahassee, had a 282 total, six under par, to finish second among 38 entries in the three-day meet. Among others, Berry defeated Florida's Doug Sanders and Don Blispinghoff to gain the runnerup position.

FSU's four-man team finished fifth, ahead of Rollins and Stetson. Miami was fourth.

FSU freshman Jack Veghte had a 75-74-71-73—293 to gain 12th place. Veghte's total was three strokes better than Florida's Jim McCoy, winner of Tallahassee's George Washington tournament last month.

Poor putting was the major cause for low scores by other FSU entries. Senior Jimmy James, runner-up in the 1953 Florida intercollegiate had a 308. Ken Peterson finished with 314.
