

Florida State avenged its only dual golf setback this spring with a 20½-6½ victory over the Rollins College Tars here yesterday.

It was the seventh win for Dr. Don Voller's Seminoles, who dropped a 14-13 decision to Rollins in Winter Park last month.

Freshman Jack Veghte of FSU was yesterday's medalist, carding a 27-40, even-par 72. FSU's Bunk Berry and Vernon Edgar

and Rollins' Ed Dinga and Bill Bodgers all had 74s.

Edgar regained some self-respect with a 3-0 win over Marlene Stewart, Rollins codd, who is the Canadian women's champion. Miss Stewart, who turned in a 79 yesterday despite difficulty with the Tallahassee Country Club's tricky course, sank a long putt on the 18th green to down Edgar and FSU in the match at Rollins in March.

Veghte squared a personal score by trimming Ed Dinga, 2-1, yesterday. Veghte and Dinga were prep rivals in New York. Dinga had defeated Veghte at Rollins.

FSU will host Southwestern of Memphis in a 1:30 match at the TCC tomorrow afternoon.
