Trailing by a point going into the last nine holes, FSU'S Bunk Berry, coasted in with a twounder par 70 to win medal honors and insure the Samipole victory.

Berry, a fifth-place finisher in last week's George Washington Birthday tourney, had one of his best days of the spring. Former state high school champ at Leon High, Berry disposed of last year's prep titlist, Frank Boynton, in his individual match.

FSU's Jack Veghte finished behind Berry in medal play with an even par 72. Boynton trailed with 73, followed by four Seminoles—Stan Ziobrowski (74), Bob Shuman (75), David Morris (76) and Bobby Dunn (77), Dunn's the ex-Georgia state high school champion.

Unless a match with Maxwell AFB comes through Saturday. FSU will be idle during the coming week. After that follows two home matches with Davidson and Auburn March 17 and 19.
