

Florida's Golfers Set Rugged Pace

Gator Teams Rank One, Two
In Tourney; FSU 5th, 6th

CORAL GABLES (AP)—University of Florida golfers went out today to sew up their third consecutive state championship in the annual intercollegiate tournament.

Florida's No. 1 team had 872 strokes at the end of 54 holes in the 72-hole tournament and appeared to be a cinch to wind up in front after the final 18 holes today. The Gators' second team was second with 903.

Miami was far back in third place with 904 strokes, followed by Rollins at 910, Florida State No. 1 team 931; Florida State No. 2 had 936, Miami Team No. 2 posted 952, with Florida Southern 960 and Stetson 1,019.

Florida's Doug Sanders led individual scorers with 214, one stroke in front of teammate Dave Ragan and Miami's Bill Graham.

Pat Schwab, defending champion from Florida, had 223 and had little hope of retaining the title he won last year.

Best score of the day was a 67 turned in by Miami's Pete Cook. It gave him a 54-hole total of 227.

The tournament is being held over the Coral Gables Biltmore course where par is 35-36—71.

Florida Linksmen Win Team Crown

Sanders Takes Individual Title
In State Tourney On 283 Total

MIAMI, April 2 (AP)—The University of Florida golf team today won the state intercollegiate tournament the third straight year. The Gators' No. 1 team scored 1,165 for 72 holes and the individual title went to Florida's

Doug Sanders.

The Gators also captured runnerup honors in both events.

Individual titlist Sanders shot a two-under-par 69 on the last 18 holes to give him 283. Four strokes back was his teammate Dave Ragan.

Art Gleason, another Gator, finished third with 290, while Rollins' Frank Boynton took fourth with 291. Miami's Bob LaFrancis was fifth with 294. Pat Schwab, defending champion from Florida finished eighth at 298.

Sanders, Schwab, Ragan and Larry Moore played on the Gator No. crown. Florida's No. 2 team, which finished second with 1,202, was made up of Gleason, Jim McCoy, Jim Cameron and Frank Cain.

Third was Miami's No. 1 team with 1,208. Rollins was fourth; Florida State No. 1 fifth; Florida State No. 2 sixth; Miami No. 2 seventh; Florida Southern eighth and Stetson ninth.
