

A pair of steady sophomores from different ends of the nation paced Florida State to its

greatest golf year this spring, final averages revealed today.

Tallahassee's Bunk Berry and Jack Veghte of Gloversville, N. Y., both finished under par as Coach Don Veller's Seminoles turned in an all-time high of 10 triumphs in 11 dual starts.

Georgia Tech was the only FSU conqueror, by a four-point margin.

Veghte, former New York state high school champion, required 790 strokes over 11 competitive rounds for an average of 71.8 strokes. Veghte turned in the season's lowest score, a six-under-par 66 against Davidson.

Berry, ex-Florida prep titlist while at Tallahassee's Leon High, used 791 strokes in 11 rounds for a 71.9 average.

The 10-man Seminole squad turned in a creditable 73.8-stroke team average for 67 individual competitive rounds.
