

Coach Don Veller's Florida State University golf team got the scare of their lives yesterday afternoon at the Tallahassee Country Club as the Seminoles just nosed Georgia's fired-up Bulldogs  $14\frac{1}{2} - 12\frac{1}{2}$ .

Behind  $10\frac{1}{2} - 7\frac{1}{2}$  with the last foursome coming up, FSU's little Billy Shelton, former Alabama state interscholastic champ, sank a long birdie three on the 18th green to pull the fat out of the fire.

Jack Veghte, playing the number three slot for the Seminoles, was medalist for the day with a two under par 70, and his fine play just did ease by Georgia's Jake Howard, Veghte's individual opponent, who came home with a 71 to lead the Bulldogs.

The FSU team played its poorest match of the year, with Veghte being the only man to break par.

The win marked the fourth straight dual victory for the Tribe, with victories over Stetson, Florida, and Auburn preceding the win over Georgia.
