

Jack Veghte's hole-in-one on the par three 8th hole was a highlight as FSU's unbeaten golf team rolled to its 7th straight victory yesterday, 16-11, over Rollins here.

Though Veghte's ace helped him to a one-under-par 71, it didn't help him against his opponent. Bob Ross came home with a 58 to beat Veghte, 3-0.

Edwin Jenkins, the steadiest player the Seminoles have had all season, was medalist for the day with a 5-under-par 67. Jenkins' effort easily defeated Rollins' Jim Curtl, who is Pennsylvania state amateur champion.

Bobby Dunn, playing in the No. 1 slot for FSU, defeated Frank Boynton, who edged Jenkins for the Florida Inter-collegiate Golf championship in Ocala two months ago.

Despite cold weather and windy conditions, the Seminoles and Tars played one of the finest college matches of the season. Not a single man in the 18 went over 76 blows.

The biggest point spread for Rollins was in the second four-some where Ross and Bob Craig defeated Veghte and Bob Shuman, 8½-1½.

The Seminoles move to Auburn Saturday afternoon for a second meeting with the Tigers. Earlier this year the Tribe whipped Auburn, 27-0.
