

**ATHENS, Ga.**—Old man par completely evaded Florida State's golfers in the first round of the Southern Intercollegiate golf tournament here Thursday.

The usually potent Seminole stickmen found Athens' 36-36 par 72 layout a puzzler, with Ed Jenkins' 73 and Jack Vehnja's 74 the closest any FSU player came to regulation figures.

Bobby Dunn, FSU's number one player throughout a season that saw the Seminoles go undefeated, sky-rocketed to a 79, blowing to a 45 on the second nine after posting a fine two-under par 34 on the front side.

#### HIGH SCORING

Billy Shelton, who led Florida State in scoring average with 72.1 strokes per round for the season, also had a rough time of it, posting a 39-42 for an 81. Lefty Harry Shoemaker played like a week-end golfer in listing a balloon 50-42 for 92.

Other FSU scores were Dick Huff, 39-35—74; Bob Shave, Jr., 36-40—76; and Bunk Berry, 37-40—77.

Tommy Matthews, lanky Georgia Tech ace, led the first day's round with a four under par 68. One stroke behind him was Earl Bowden of the University of Georgia, and Florida's Dave Ragen held down third position with a two under par 70.

Georgia and Houston tied for team honors with a total of 291. Georgia Tech was third with 293, North Texas State and Miami tied for fourth with 296, followed by Florida's 297 and Rollins' 301.

#### TO BE TRIMMED

The field will be cut after today's play and the final 36 holes are scheduled for tomorrow.

Marlene Stewart, Canadian Women's Amateur champion, be-

came the first girl to play in the tournament as a team member. The port Rollins College coed drew the biggest gallery of the day but finished far down the list with a 45-41—86.

## **ATHENS, Ga.—Four Florida State golfers move into the final 72 holes of play this afternoon in the Southern Intercollegiate Golf Tournament.**

Bob Shave, with a 36 hole total of 146, leads the Seminole contingent into today's 36 hole wind-up. The other three FSU players qualifying for the final include Edwin Jenkins at 151; Dick Huff at 151; and Jack Veghte, also with a 151 total.

### **FOUR NOSED OUT**

Players scoring 152 or better on the first 36 holes were the only ones qualifying for the final round. This excluded such FSU stars as Robby Dunn, who finished the first 36 hole test with 153, Billy Shelton, also with 153, Bunk Berry with another 153, and Harry Shoemaker with a 155.

Poor first rounds by these four Seminoles left them out in the cold for the finals. Dunn carded a 74 yesterday to go with his first round 79. Shelton made a fine come-back yesterday with a 72, but his first round 81 left him one stroke shy of making today's

play.

Shoemaker, who had an 82 in the first round, recovered with a good 73 today, and was three strokes in the red. Berry carded a 76 to go with his first round 77 and he too was left in the lurch by one stroke.

The University of Florida won the Southeastern Conference championship play for the second year in a row, and finished third in the Southern Intercollegiate title race. North Texas State won the tournament team title, with Houston finishing second ahead of Florida.

### **RAGAN LEADS**

Dave Ragan of Florida leads the field into today's finals with a 36 hole score of 140. His total places him two strokes in front of North Texas' Bobby Maxwell. Cecil Calhoun of Louisiana State is tied for third with Tommy Matthews of Georgia Tech at 144. Matthews, the first round leader with 68, soared to 76 yesterday.

Marlene Stewart, the pert little feminine swinger from Rollins, carded a 77 yesterday to go with her first round 83 for a total of 160.

ATHENS, May 5 (AP) — Dave Ragan, 20-year-old University of Florida Junior, put together rounds of 71 and 73 today to finish five strokes ahead of Dick Whetzle of North Texas State and win the 19th Southern Intercollegiate Golf Tournament.

Ragan's card for the 72-hole tournament was 70-70-71-73—284. Whetzle, who went into the last

round in a four-way tie for fourth place, knocked two strokes from par to finish with a 70 and a 289 total.

Alabama's Sonny Holt came home with 75 and 71 to move into third place with a 291.

in a tie for eighth after 54 holes.

Ending in a tie for fourth were Bob Shave of Florida State and Dick Parvino of Houston with 292s.

Parvino had a 73-74. Shave shot the last two rounds in 75 and 71.

Shave had successive rounds of 76, 70, 75 and 71.
