

Florida Golfers Paced by Seminole

Florida's No. 1 team, the University of Florida, paced the Florida State Golf Association's annual tournament in the annual Florida Winter Intercollegiate Golf Tournament.

FSU's No. 1 team, led by captain Edwin Jenkins, posted a 283 reading one stroke ahead of the University of Florida first team.

Captain Edwin Jenkins of Florida State fired a 69 for runner-up honors behind Berry. Other members of the Florida

State team were Berry Shumaker with a 70 and Bob Shive with a 71.

FSU No. 1 team's other members were Dave Morris with 72, Bob Shumaker with 73, and Billy Shelton with 74.

Florida's golfers were paced by Jim McCoy, who posted a 70, and Pete Trenham with a 72.

Following the Seminoles and Gators were Rollins with a team total of 299, University of Florida No. 2 team with 304; Miami No. 2 with 306; Florida Southern with 310; and Miami No. 1 with 312.

The Seminoles' showing was a far cry from their most recent dual meet when they bowed to the University of Florida linksters in Tallahassee by a 14½-12½ count.

Both team and individual titles are determined on the full 72 holes of medal play, which winds up with 18 holes tomorrow.

OCALA (AP)—After three spectacular rounds of golf, Quak Berry and his Florida State University teammates needed only mediocre scores today to walk off with the two top prizes in the 72-hole Florida intercollegiate tournament.

Berry's 66-67-65 for 198 have him seven strokes ahead of Jack Veghte, also of FSU. No one else did better than 210 after 54 holes over the 6-430-yard Ocala Municipal Course.

The FSU No. 1 team had 832. University of Florida No. 1 was second at 868.

Other teams, in order, were Rollins 870, FSU No. 2 881, Florida Southern 907, Miami No. 1 909, Florida No. 2 918 and Miami No. 2 926.

Berry played the second nine in 20 strokes in getting his 65 yesterday. He eagled the 500-yard 17th hole, dropping a No. 6 iron shot

10 feet from the hole and sinking the putt.

Veghte had rounds of 70-66-67 in compiling his 205.

Bob Shave Jr., also of FSU, and Bob Ross of Rollins had 210. Dean

Refram of Florida Southern and Harry Shoemaker of FSU 211. Ed Jenkins of FSU 213, Bob Brue of Miami 214 and three from the University of Florida 215—Tom Aaron, Hale Baugh and Art Gleason.

OCALA, March 16 (AP)—Bunk Barry, a slender geology student, and his teammates on Florida State University No. 1 team walked away with top honors in the Florida Intercollegiate Golf Tournament today.

Barry finished the 72-hole play with 287, an excellent record for the 6,800-yard par 71 municipal course. He had rounds of 65-67.

Barry, Ed Jenkins, Bob Shave and Harry Shoemaker had 1,120 strokes for top spot, 28 better than the 1,148 by University of Florida

No. 1 team composed of Tom Aaron, Jim McCoy, Hale Baugh and Art Gleason.

Other team standings: Rollins 1,171; FSU No. 2 1,188; Miami No. 1, 1,211; Florida Southern 1,236; Florida No. 2, 1,248; Miami No. 2 1,251.

Jack Veghte, a member of the FSU No. 2 team, had 277 for second place in individual play. State of FSU was third with 51; Agnes of Florida fourth with 32; and Art Gleason, of Florida fifth at 24.

Barry, former state high school champion at Tallahassee

Leon, finished 18 strokes under par; Veghte was seven under; Shave three under; Harry Shoemaker one under and Captain Ed Jenkins one over for Florida State.

It was the second straight Florida Intercollegiate championship for the Seminoles and this year's score were much better than last year's.

Dr. Don Veller's squad has three tough dual matches coming up this week, including Georgia Tech Monday, Alabama Wednesday and Georgia Thursday—all in Tallahassee.
