

OCALA (AP)—Bob Ross and his Rollins College golf team led the way into today's double round of the Florida Inter-Collegiate golf tournament.

Ross shot 66, five under par, in yesterday's first round. His teammate, Rowland Lamontagne, had the second best individual score of 70. Two other Rollins golfers, Dick Diversi and Joe Miller, had 75 each, giving the Tara a team score of 266.

Florida and Florida State tied for second in team competition with 298 each. Then came Miami with 301, Florida Southern with

308, FSU No. 2 with 322, Florida No. 2 with 329 and Stetson with 334.

Both team and individual titles are based on the full 72-hole play over the 6,430-yard Ocala municipal course. An 18-hole round tomorrow winds up the event.

Five entrants, including the defending champion, Tommy Aaron of Florida, shot 71. Bob Shave, Mel Fleischer and Frank Malara, all of FSU, and Frank Beard of Florida also had 71.

Two strokes farther back at 73 came James Parker and Doug Putnam of Florida and Jim Peace of Miami.

Gil Buckingham and Dick Guardiola, both of Miami, had 74 each; Downing Grey of FSU 75, along with Rollins' Diversi and Miller.

Other FSU scores included Dick Dunlap, 76; Rem Noble, 78; Wayne Timberman, 79; Dick Parker, 80; Rock Fraleigh, 81; Phil Fagen and Mike Stauffer, 82, and John Fraleigh, 85.

OCALA (AP)—Florida and its sophomore star Frank Beard held a slight lead going into today's final round of the State Intercollegiate Golf Tournament.

Beard led the individual competition with 209 after three rounds, three strokes ahead of Florida State's Bob Shave and six ahead of the defending champion, Tommy Aaron of Florida. Bob Ross of Rollins also was in the running at 217.

Florida's team of Beard, Aaron, James Parker with 236 and Doug Putnam with 234 had a three-round total of 875. FSU had 880 and Rollins 888.

Beard shot 66 in the third round, making several long putts, and moved into the lead after earlier rounds of 71 and 72 over the 6,430-yard par 72 Ocala Municipal Course.

Shave had 66 in the third round after earlier scores of 71 and 72. Aaron's three rounds were 71, 72 and 72. Ross had 66, 70 and 72.

Other individual leaders included Frank Malara of FSU at 219, Joe Kirby of Florida Southern at 220, Richard Leontang of Rollins at 222 and Mel Fletcher of Rollins at 224.

OCALA (AP)— Frank Beard, University of Florida golf star, shot a 75 on the final 18 Saturday to win the Florida Intercollegiate Golf Tournament.

A 5-under par 66 round Friday over the 6,430-yard Ocala municipal course had boosted him into front position by three strokes after 54 holes.

His 284 for the 72 holes was seven better than his nearest competitor, Frank Malara of Florida State University who finished second with 291.

Bob Shave of Florida State and Tommy Aaron of Florida tied for third spot with 292s.

Florida also took the team competition, based on the four lowest Florida players' scores, with 1176. Florida State No. 1 team was second with 1181.

Florida State No. 1 team score in addition to Shave and Malara included Downing Gray with 297 and Mel Fleischer with 301.
