

PENSACOLA — Florida State University took a 10-stroke lead today at the halfway point of an unofficial triangular golf meet.

FSU's 18-hole total — the combined score of its four lowest golfers — was one over par 289. Auburn has 299 and Alabama 309.

The final 18 holes in the medal play event will be tomorrow over the 6,392-yard Pensacola Country Club course.

Bob Shave of FSU turned in the best round of the day, a one under par 71. He had a sizzling 33 on the first nine but blew to 38 on the back nine.

Other FSU scores were Frank Malara, 38-34—72; Wayne Timberman, 38-33—72; Mel Fleischer, 38-36—74; and Dick Dunlap, 39-35—74.

Auburn's low man was Bryant Harvard, 38-34—72.

The match was arranged by Pensacola Golf officials to try to interest youngsters in collegiate golf.

PENSACOLA — FSU golfers finished their season with a victory here yesterday in a triangular meet with Auburn and Alabama.

The victory gives the Seminoles a season's record of 8-5-1.

FSU's 576 was the low medal score yesterday, followed by Auburn's 605 and Alabama's 620.

Team co-captain Bob Shave, playing his last match for FSU, was medalist with 71-70—141.

Other members of the winning FSU team were Wayne Timberman, 72-71, 143; Frank Malara, 72-73, 145; Mel Fleisher, 74-73, 147.

Bryant Harvard was medalist for Auburn with a 72-72, 144.

Downing Gray and Dickie Dunlap posted a 148 and 152 respectively for the Seminoles, but did not figure in the team results.

Along with Shave, co-captain Fleisher wound up his Seminole career yesterday.
