Zarley fired a 71 and increased his lead to two strokes with a 36-hole total of 139.

Georgia, however, making a huge runaway of the concurrent Southeastern Conference team competition, barged into second place in the overall reckoning with a team total of 580 compared to Houston's leading 5757.

Still in a good spot for a shot at the title at 143 were Peter Green of North Carolina (74-69), Bryan Bergeron of Florida State (73-70), Jerry Potter of Miami (73-70, Bill Graham of Murray State (70-70) and Jimmy Gabrielson of Georgia (71-72).

Florida State was third behind Houston and Georgia in the team race with a 500 aggregate, followed by Auburn and Florida, the SEC runnersup, with 505.

FSU's Bill Odeneal won second place in the coaches portion of the tourney. ATHENS, Ga. 45 — Houston's Homero Blancas charged from seven strokes behind with scores of 69 and 70 here yesterday and won the Southern Intercollegiate golf championship with a 285 to tal.

It marked the second straight year Houston has swept both individual and team trophies.

Georgia's David Boyd and Houston's Wright Garrett tied for second at 287.

Houston's winning score was 1,154, 16 strokes better than that of second place Georgia.
