

Florida State University's golf team finished play with a 14-3 record, one victory short of last year's record 15 triumphs.

The team also finished third in two tournaments' the All-American Invitational and the Southern Intercollegiate.

Two of the three losses came at the hands of state rival Florida, a team which the Seminoles beat in two other seasonal meetings. The other loss was to another state rival, University of Miami.

Sophomore Dave Philo of Schenectady, N. Y., led the golfers with a 74.3 average. He was followed by seniors Bryan Bergeron (75) and Chuck Keating (75.4).

Philo was the only Seminole to break 70 during the season. He fired a 68 on one occasion, a 69 on another.

The FSU freshmen finished with an 8-2 record.

The Tribe graduates six lettermen in June, but the promising freshman squad, along with Philo and a nucleus of returning juniors, forecast a good year.

Coach Bill Odeneal's overall record for five seasons now stands at 56-22-3.
