

**CAPE CORAL** —Florida State's golfers trailed Houston and Miami Thursday after opening rounds of the All-Florida Tournament being staged here this weekend. The 86 golfers entered in the amateur meet go into second round play today.

Houston's four-man entry finished Thursday rounds with an 18-hole total of 293 to take the lead, Miami followed with 294 and FSU had 299.

Trailing the Seminoles in fourth place was Wake Forest, which totaled 306.

Houston's typically great team led in team points, but two Miami golfers stole the show with fine individual rounds. Paul Dejornis had a 70 Thursday, while teammate Jerry Potter carded a 71 over the par 72 course.

Two Seminoles, John Parsons and Bill Boutwell, toured the course in 74 strokes, while Denny Lyons finished with a 75 and Richie Karl a 4-over-par 76.

**CAPE CORAL (AP)** — Jay Sigel of Wake Forest overcame a three-stroke deficit in the final round and defeated Paul DesJardins of the University of Miami on the second hole of a sudden death playoff to win the Florida Intercollegiate Golf Tournament Saturday.

The University of Houston ran away with the team title for the fourth straight year with a total of 1,175.

Sigel, a 21-year-old junior, was still three holes behind DesJardins, leader since opening day, when they rounded the turn for the last nine. The defending Atlantic Coast Conference champion pulled two strokes ahead with the final hole to go while DesJardins' game blew up.

However, the pressure got to Sigel on the final hole and he shot a double-bogey seven for a 73 and a total of 291. DesJardins sank a four-foot putt to force the sudden death. His final round was four-over-par 76.

Both shot par-five on the first hole of the playoff.

On the second, DesJardins trapped his tee shot and blasted beyond the green into a thicket of rough grass. He then chipped into a trap and had trouble getting out.

Sigel was down in five after emerging from a trap to within four feet of the pin.

Houston teammates Marty Fleckman and Wright Garrett came in third and fourth with 292 and 291 respectively. Lourie Hammer of Florida was fifth with 293.

Following Houston in team standings were Miami 1,213, Wake Forest 1,217, Florida State 1,218, Florida 1,240, Rollins 1,248, Florida Southern 1,283, Columbia 1,311, Stetson 1,389 and Florida Presbyterian 1,438.
