The members of the winning team which had a score of 578, are Jay Sigel, Folkes, Don Hedrick, and Dennis Milne. Sigel and Folkes gave the Descons the surge they needed to overcome Georgia which finished at. 581 for second place. The Bulldogs total was good ] enough for a fourth straight Southeastern Conference title. Georgia now has won 11 conference championships since the 1 tournament began in 1937. Tennessee's Bert Green started the day with a rash of birdies ġ, and an eagle for a front nine score of 31, but took 40 strokes on the backside for a one-underpar 71. This tied him with 1 Folkes at 141.
