A teammate of Spears, Bill Ridout, posted a 67-71—138, but was penalized four strokes on each 18 holes for having 15 clubs in his bag. His revised total was 146.

Florida State's Hubert Green was second behind Spears, one stroke back at 212. Then came Florida's Steve Melnyk, Dave Oakley and Phil Rideout with 214.

FSU's team total was 869, followed by Miami (891), Rollins (923), St. Leo (927), University of South Florida (939), Stetson (946), Jackson-ville (966), Florida Southern (967) and Embry-Riddle (1180).

Florida also won the freshman division.
