Darr Leads College Golf Tourney

GAINESVILLE — Unheralded John Darr stole the show from kingpin Steve Melynk and steady Ed Hoard and propelled the Florida Gator golf team into the first-day lead in the Florida Intercollegiate Championship held here yesterday at the College course.

Darr fired an opening 37-35 — par 72 and then came back to tack on another 35 on the front side to become the only man in the 72-player field to break par.

Darr played consistent golf all the way. He fired five birdies, had four bogeys and the rest pars. His 107 led the Gators to a 438 total, 18 better than second-place Florida State. Surprising Stetson was third with 466, then came Miami at 469, St. Leo 473, Rollins 474, South Florida of Tampa 477, Jacksonville 480, Biscayne College of Miami 483 and Embry Riddle 529.

Melynk, who finished fifth in the NCAA Tournament last year, started out like he was going to lead the field. He could do no better than 37 on the front side but then blazed home with a four-under-par 32 on the back to take the 18hole lead at 69.

## Gators, Melynk Capture Southern Collegiate Golf

GAINESVILLE – Burly Steve Melynk sunk a pressure-filled 20-foot putt on a wet, cold 18th green here yesterday to win medalist honors and lead his Florida Gator golf team tc its second straight Florida Intercollegiate Championship.

AS TEMPERATURES dropped from the high 60's to the low 40's and a driving rain pelted the 6,098, par 72 University Course, Melynk rallied to edge out teammates John Darr and Richard Spears for individual honors.

Darr was the first-day leader with a 107 for 27 holes but Melynk, who trailed by three, quickly wiped that out by carding a two-under par 34 on the back side. Darr could get only 38 while Spears shot 36.

Darr and Spears both shot 38s on the front side but Melynk, shooting a 36, was increasing his lead to three strokes.

THESE THREE helped the Gators easily win the overall championship. Grouped with Ed Hoard's 228, they totaled 888 strokes, 27 better than second-place Florida State, which was led by Ron Philo with 225, Hubert Green with 228 and Andy Thompson with 229.

Miami rallied behind Russ Helwig's 225 to finish third with 923. Rollins came in fourth with 944, edging St. Leo, who had 948. Stetson, who was in third after 27 holes, dropped back to sixth with 954 strokes. South Florida of Tampa finished seventh with 962, nipping Jacksonville, who had 966. Biscayne ended up ninth with 973 and Embry Riddle brought up the rear with 1071.
