WINTER HAVEN — Florida State's golf team found the Willowbrook Country Club course quite to its liking and rolled to the first day lead in the Florida Intercollegiate golf tournament here.

Getting excellent play from Bob Huber, the Seminoles finished with the first 36 holes Friday with a 585 total.

Tied for second place were the University of Miami and Florida with 590 totals while Jacksonville had 600 and Rollins 602.

Huber was low man for the Tribe with a 144 score. Mark Alwin fired 147, Mike Cheek and Jim Keedy 148s, Steve Barber 149.

There are 15 schools in competition. UF won last year, FSU second.

WINTER HAVEN A(AP) — Senior James Keedy knuckled down for a 71 Saturday and a 219 total for 54 holes to help Florida State University to a 20-stroke victory in the Florida Intercollegiate Golf Tournament. Florida was second and Miami was third.

FSU's Bob Huber and Miami's Mike Slipko tied for the lead after 36 holes with identical 144s, four strokes better than Keedy, but Hubert slouched to a 78 Saturday and Slipko ballooned to 80.

Keedy had trouble in the first two rounds, managing 74s both days. But on Saturday he had help in moving the Seminoles to the fore. Teammates Mike

Cheek, Mark Alwin, Jim Barber and Huber combined with Keedy to give Florida State the top five spots in individual competition. Keedy, 21, is from Leesburg.

Florida State went into Saturday's round with a five-stroke lead over Florida, but increased that to 20 strokes in the final round Saturday.

In team competition, Florida State posted an 874 total, followed by Florida with 894 strokes and Miami with 895. Jacksonville was fourth with 906, followed by Rollins with 913, Tampa 925, Stetson 944, St. Leo 947, Florida Southern 948, Biscayne 958, Florida A&M 968, Florida Institute of Technology 988, Embry Riddle 1,011 and Florida Atlantic 1,053.
