

Florida State's golf team was a poor host Monday at the first annual Seminole Invitational Golf Tournament — the Seminoles not only captured first place but also walked off with second place team honors.

Seminole Coach Scott Fletcher entered both Florida State's regular varsity and the Tribe B-team, and they finished one-two with 288 and 305 totals over the FSU course.

Mark Alwin paced the Tribe varsity with a blazing 68 — four under par over the recently opened 18 hole university course.

No other golfer on this balmy afternoon was able to break par, although Florida State's John Calabria and Georgia Southern's Bob Simmons were in the 72's.

Following the Seminoles in

the team standings was the Alabama varsity with a 306. Then came Georgia Southern at 309 and Columbus (Ga.) College at 311.

The Alabama B-team, West Florida, Florida A&M and Gulf Coast J.C. rounded out the nine team field in that order.
