MOBILE, Ala. — Florida State's golf team finished second to Alabama in the annual Senior Bowl Tournament. Florida was third in the 12-team field.

For the 36 holes of action, Alabama had a total team score of 739, compared with Florida State's 756 and Florida's 760.

Following, in order, were LSU of New Orleans (675), Tennessee (768), Miami (770), Georgia Tech (783), Auburn (785), Southern Mississippi (792), Tennessee Tech (793), Kentucky (797), South Alabama (799) and Tulane (816).

Behind a strong effort from all members of the team, the Florida State golf squad rolled to a second place finish in the weekend Senior Bowl Tournament held in Montgomery, Ala.

Ben Voyles was the low

scorer for FSU in the two-day meet conducted by the host University of Alabama. Voyles shot a 146 which placed him fourth in the individual standings.

John Ruby and Mark Alwin, two other Seminole strokers,

tied for seventh place with a mark of 151 each while Johnny Godwin had a 155 for his efforts.

Alabama, one of the most powerful teams in the Southeast this year, won the tourney with a score of 739 for its five participants. FSU finished 17 strokes back with a 756.

One of the brighter spots of the meet was that the Seminoles defeated the University of Florida. The Gators finished third in the competition with a score of 761, five behind FSU.

Louisiana State University of New Orleans took fourth.

This was the first meet of the new year for the Seminoles and the next one on tap for the linksmen will be the Florida Intercollegiates held in Winter Haven, Fla., on Feb. 18, 19 and 20. All teams from around the state will be featured including Florida and Miami.
