WINTER HAVEN — The University of Florida, sparked by a course record 63 by Gary Coke, jumped into a 19-stroke lead in the Florida Intercollegiate golf tournament Friday at the Willow Brook Country Club.

Coke added a 69 for a 36-hole total of 132 to grab the individual lead. His 63 broke the course record of 64 held by Florida State's Mark Alwin.

Florida's team total was 559, 17-strokes under par. FSU is

second with 578, two over par, trailed by South Florida and Jacksonville, tied at 580, and Miami (585).

Tony Haderer of Miami is second individually with 136, then Lee Edwards of Jacksonville and Alwin of FSU at 140.

Rounding out the FSU team were John Ruby (145), Ben Voyles (147), Steve Mullins (146), Doug Fischesser (151) and Ben Steele (154).

The teams will play 18 holes today to finish the 54-hole tourney.
