Andy North of the University of Florida came within two strokes of the course record 64, to lead the Gators to a convincing 24-stroke lead after the second round of the Seminole Invitational Golf Tournament here.

The tournament ends today, with a shotgun start at 10 a.m.

North ripped through the back nine with a five-under par

32 for a total of 66 for the day to take a six-stroke lead over teammate Gary Koch at 143. No one else is under par for 36 holes.

Co-leaders Woody Blackburn of Florida and Lee Harper of Alabama both faltered Saturday, Blackburn shooting a 75 to drop to third, while Harper balooned to 79 for a 148 total, 11 back.

FSU's John Ruby shot a 71 to move into a fourth-place tie with Ron Haigler of West Florida and Bob Scheuer of Miami—all three at 146.

One stroke back is Tom Knapp of South Florida at 147.

Florida leads the team race with a total of 569, followed by Alabama at 593, FSU at 595 and Georgia Southern at 601.

North had far-and-away the best score of the day. Only

four other golfers had par as the course continued to baffle the majority of the field. Buford Jones of Georgia Southern had a 70, while Ruby, Koch and Sam Rachaels of Columbus College each had 71's. Andy North finished with an eight-under par 208 for 52 holes to win individual honors and lead the Florida Gators to a 26-stroke victory in the Seminole Invitational golf tournament held over the weekend here.

North followed a 66 on Saturday with a one-under par 71 Sunday, and was the only golfer out of an 84-man field to play 54 holes under par. Teammate Woody Blackburn was runnerup with 220.

The Gators took three of the top four places to easily out-distance the field. Florida State was runnerup with a total of 896, followed by Alabama at 900.

Georgia Southern took fourth, edging LSU by a stroke, 913-914. Memphis State was two back at 916, followed by West Florida and South Florida at 921, Miami (922), Columbus College (923), FSU No. 2 (927), Chipola JC (923), Ball State (947) and Florida A&M (972).

North took top honors for the second day with a one-under par 71 as the course proved very tricky. Only North and FSU's Mark Alwin could solve the course for par or better.

Alwin made a strong rush at even-par 72 to fall just short of overtaking Blackburn for runnerup honors. He and Gary Koch of Florida tied for third at 221. Wheeler Stewart of Alabama was fifth at 223 and another Gator, Steve Morgan was next at 223.
