The faces have changed, but Florida State's situation at the Gulf American Corporation Intercollegiate Golf Championships is just about the same as it was a year ago.

The Seminoles with a 293 total after one round of play are in fourth place behind Houston, (286) North Carolina (290), and Florida (291) but the Tribe is just seven strokes back.

"That is just where we were last year," said Tribe Coach Scott Fletcher. "Of course that was with a senior team and they are gone, now. But I think our kids are starting to come around now and we may be able to hang in there with them."

Last year the Seminole made up that seven stroke difference and went on to win the GAC Tournament.

There are 40 teams com-

peting in this year's tourney and after the first day only 13 strokes separate the first seven schools. Behind the Seminoles come East Tennessee (295), Miami (298) and Miami of Ohio (299).

North Carolina's Billy West shot a blistering six under par 66 to take the first round individual lead, three strokes better than Jeff Heilman of ETSU and Tom Jenkins of Houston.

Steve Mullen with a 71 and Mark Alwin with a 72 led FSU's contingent. Mullens was sixth and Alwin in a four-way tie for seventh in the individual standings.

Other Seminoles were a 74 by Bill Voyles and a trio of 76's by John Ruby, Ben Voyles and Robby Wilson.

The four day tournament over the par-72 Cape Coral Country Club Course concludes Saturday.

CAPE CORAL (AP) — Andy North of Florida fired a 68 to lead individual scorers in the GAC Intercollegiate Golf Classic Thursday, but Houston's four-man total of 560 after two days put the Texas entry in command of the team competition.

North's 68 combined with a first-round 70 to give him a total of 138, one stroke better than Houston golfers Corker deLoach and Tom Jenkins. De Loach shot a 67 Thursday, while Jenkins had a 70.

Also at 139 was North Carolina's Marty West, who went round in 73 Thursday after an opening day round of 66.

ing champion Florida State was third at 589.

Ben Voyles' 73 was the day's best round for Florida State yesterday. Mark Alwin and John Ruby had 74s, and Steve Mullens added a 75.

**CAPE CORAL** — Florida State clung precariously to its third-place spot after three rounds of the Gulf American Intercollegiate golf tourney Friday while Houston roared away from the field.

Houston, with blistering 13-under par 835 total, led second-place Florida by 24 strokes. The Gators, in turn held a 17-stroke advantage over the Seminoles, who had an 876 total.

The University of Miami was just five strokes behind FSU and North Carolina is four behind the Hurricanes. Then come Rollins, Maryland, Michigan State, New Mexico State and Purdue.

Houston's John Mills and Tom Jenkins are running one-two in the individual race with 208 and 209 totals.

Florida State's John Ruby is just 10 strokes behind the leader at 218 after shooting a four-under par 68 Friday. Ruby is in 10th place followed by teammates Mark Alwin at 219 and Steve Mullen at 220.

The four-day tournament concludes today.

**CAPE CORAL** — Houston was a runaway winner and Florida State finished fourth as the 8th annual Cape Coral golf tournament wound up here yesterday.

The Cougars had a total of 1125 in the four-day tourney, while Florida was second with 1152. The University of Miami went past FSU on the final day and ended with 1165 to 1178 for the Seminoles.

Following FSU was N.C., Maryland, Purdue, Michigan State, South Florida and New Mexico State.

Houston's John Mills took individual honors with 279, while teammate Com Jenkins was second at 282. UF's Gary Koch took third with a 283 total.

FSU's top man was Mark Alwin who had a 74 Saturday to finish with a 293 total. Steve Mullen had a 297, John Ruby 298 and Ben Bill Voulex both had 303s.
