

FSU Golfers Are Second

PINE MOUNTAIN, Ga. (AP) — Wake Forest maintained a four-stroke lead and Florida State surged into second place in the wind-plagued second round of the All-Dixie Intercollegiate Golf Championship Saturday at Callaway Gardens.

The Wake Forest team, which held a five-point lead with a 293 total Friday, soared to a 312 team score Saturday in the rain and blustery wind for a two-day total of 605.

Florida State, tied at seventh with Louisiana State Friday with a 304, charged through the poor playing conditions with a 305 to gain second place with a two-day total of 609.

Seminoles Place 2nd In All-Dixie

PINE MOUNTAIN, Ga. (AP) — Wake Forest wrapped up the All-Dixie Intercollegiate Golf Championship at Callaway Gardens Sunday after shooting steady golf for three days for a team total of 904.

Wake Forest, which won the All-Dixie in 1970 and tied for second last year, led from the first day, shooting a 293 total Friday and a 312 Saturday in the rain and wind.

Medalist honors went to Jimmy Ellis of Georgia Southern, who shot a 72-73-76 for a total of 221. Buddy Marucci of Maryland was close behind with a 73-76-74—225.

The temperature dipped into the 50s Sunday when the golfers teed off for the last 18 holes as bad weather continued to plague the tournament.

Florida State continued in second place by shooting a 308 for the day.

Georgia Southern shot a tournament total of 918 and Memphis State shot 925.

Lloyd Liebler trophy winner for the most birdies was Billy Chapman of Wake Forest, with 10 birdies. The trophy is named after a late University of Georgia golfer from Portsmouth, Va., who died last year of cancer.

There were 21 teams who competed in the tournament, which is sponsored by Columbus College.
