

FSU In Second In Golf Tourney

WINTER HAVEN — The University of Florida and Florida State streaked ahead after 18 holes in the Florida Intercollegiate golf tournament yesterday with the Gators leading the Seminoles by four strokes.

UF posted a 279 and FSU 283.

In third place was Florida Atlantic and West Florida at 289.

Gary Kock of UF was the individual leader with a five - under - par 67, one stroke ahead of FSU's Jim Ihnot.

Bob Impaglia of FSU shot a two - under 70, while teammates John Ruby had a 71, Ray Thompson a 74 and Todd Crandell a 75.

WINTER HAVEN — The University of Florida had a 54-hole total of 847 at the end of the third round of play Friday for a 21 stroke lead over Miami in the Florida Intercollegiate Golf Tournament.

Miami moved ahead of Florida State in Friday's play, dropping the Seminoles into third with 869.

Florida's Gary Koch continued to lead the individual competition with a 10-under-par 206.

The Florida State totals are Bob Impaglia 220, John Ruby 221, Kim Heisler 222, Ray Thompson 223 and Todd Crandall 223.

Tied at 215 were Kip Minter of Florida, Bill Duncan of Florida and Fred Coughanour of Florida Atlantic. Four other golfers were tied at 216.

The final round of 18 hole, will be played Saturday.

Finish Third

WINTER HAVEN — Florida State's bid for a second Florida Intercollegiate golf championship in three years fell short here Saturday when the Seminoles finished third to Florida and Miami.

Florida shot a 1,132 for the three-day, 72 hole tournament. Miami had a 1,162 and Florida State, a 1,165. Thirteen teams were entered.

Florida State's Jim Ihnot finished with a four over par 292, 10th best among individual totals. Gary Cock of Florida was the individual medalist with a 13 under par 275.
