

# Deacons Capture Schenkel

STATESBORO, Ga. (AP) — Curtis Strange birdied the 18th hole for a par 71 to capture low medalist honors and lead Wake Forest to the team championship in Statesboro Sunday in the fourth annual Chris Schenkel Invitational Golf Tournament.

In second place was the No. 1 team in the nation, the University of Florida, with a total of 1,076. Gary Koch and Andy Bean both had three-over-par 74s on Sunday.

Third place went to the University of Alabama, with a team total of 1,084. Bill Karbowski eagled the 18th hole for a 69, giving the Crimson Tide their low round for the day.

Billy Kratzert fired a 69 to boost the University of Georgia to fourth place with a team total of 1,089.

Host team Georgia Southern came in fifth, with Buddy Alexander scoring a 74 for a team total Sunday of 1,095.

Behind Strange for the individual titles were Kratzert and Jerry Pate of Alabama, with 209, Bean at 211, Jay Hahn, of Wake Forest, 212, Alexander, Stan Lee, of Louisiana State University, Phil Small of Furman, and Bob Byman of Wake Forest, 213, and Koch, at 214.

Other team scores were Auburn and LSU, 1,1010 East Tennessee State, 1,102; Memphis State, 1,110; Indiana University, 1,118; Furman, 1,119; Florida State, 1,120; South Carolina, 1,122; Middle Tennessee State, 1,132; Kentucky, 1,137; Tennessee, 1,138; Rollins College, Winter Park, Fla., 1,143; Columbus College, 1,155; Davidson, 1,177 and Georgia Tech, 1,188.
