The Deacons, NCAA national golf champions the past two years, gained their fifth championship in the seventh edition of the tournament with a team total of 883, eleven strokes ahead of runnerup Georgia.

Behind third-place Georgia Southern at 898 fell Furman 912, Maryland 914, Auburn 923, Clemson and Troy State 925, Florida State 926, and South Carolina 927.
