

LSU in lead, FSU is 4th in own golf

Jim Adams and Louis Lee each fired even par 72s Saturday to propel Louisiana State into a one-shot lead after the second round of the Seminole Golf Classic.

Georgia, led by Gus Sylvann's 71 over the 7,000-yard, par 72 Seminole Golf Course, tied Auburn for second place at 585. Host Florida State was fourth with 587, followed by defending champion Florida, the first-round leader, at 590.

Sylvann's round tied him for the individual lead after 36 holes with Gary Pinns of Georgia Southern and Harry Taylor of Tennessee, all at even-par 144. Pinns shot a 72 Saturday and Taylor a 71.

Adams and Lee were among four players tied at 145. Defending individual champion Bill Hancock of Florida, the first-round leader, and Buddy Gardner of Auburn were also in the bunch after rounds of 74 and 73, respectively.

At 146 were Bob Dumas of Auburn, Scott Landy of Tennessee and Terry Anton and Kenny Szuch of FSU. Szuch had the day's best round, a 69.

The Seminole knocked in 20-foot putts twice in the round that included five birdie and two bogeys. Szuch also had birdie putts of six feet, three feet and two inches.

Six players were tied at 147 and included Joe Pope of Mississippi State, Clarence Jones of Florida International, Chip Sank of Georgia, Jim Becker of Georgia, Steve Crommel of LSU and Mike Pratt of Maryland.

Auburn golfers in win

Florida State's golf team charged into the lead after the front nine holes but then let it slip away and Auburn came away with the seventh-annual Seminole Golf Classic Sunday afternoon at the FSU golf course.

Auburn finished with an 874 total, two strokes in front of Florida State. Georgia and LSU finished in a tie for third, and Florida was fifth.

The Seminoles moved from fourth to first after the first nine Sunday afternoon to lead the field of 26 teams. But Auburn, led by Ron Holt's sizzling 69, rallied to take the victory.

Holt was the Tigers' sixth player, and his 81 and 76 the first two days were not even good enough to qualify for Auburn's totals. But his round Sunday matched the previous best of the tournament, shot by FSU's Kenny Szuch on Saturday.

Auburn was in third going into the final round, two strokes ahead of fourth-place Florida State. Louisiana State, the second-round leader, and Georgia had a 293 and 292, respectively, on the final day.

Phil Hancock of Florida won the individual honors with a 215 total. His three day scores were 71, 74, and 70.

Four were bunched at 217 to share second place: Buddy Garrdner of Auburn, Gus Sylvann and Chip Beck of Georgia, and Harry Taylor of Tennessee.

Five more were in a group at 219; Tarry Anton and Kenny Knox of FSU; Rick Karbowski of Auburn, and Louis Lee and Eddie Lyons of LSU.

Knox had Florida State's best round of the day, a 70. Anton and Szuch, who finished with a 220 total, each had a 74.
