

## Seminoles rank 2nd

CAPE CORAL — Florida State, paced by Chip Curley's three-under par 69, was in second place after the Inter-collegiate opening round of the 12th annual Golf Classic here yesterday.

The Seminoles were, however, five strokes of the leading pace being set by East Tennessee, which compiled a team score of 281 with three players breaking par with rounds of 70s.

FSU was at 286 and two strokes in front of Indiana in the 19-team field.

Individually for the the Seminoles, Richard Jefferies fired a one-under par 71 to go with Curley's 69.

Terry Antone had a 73, Kenny Szuich a 73, Kenny Knox a 74 and Tonie Antone a 75 for the Seminoles

## FSU golfers in lead

CAPE CORAL — Florida State's Tom Anton fired a five-under-par 67 Thursday to spark the Seminoles into first place at the halfway point in the 12th annual GAC Cape-Coral Classic golf tournament.

The Seminoles, 12-under as a team for the first two rounds with a 564 total, lead East Tennessee State by five strokes. Indiana and Florida are tied for third at 577 and Jacksonville and Miami are next with 579. Nineteen teams from ten states are competing.

East Tennessee State's Olin Callicut is the individual leader in the tournament with a 36-hole total of 140. FSU's Chip Curley is tied with three others — UF's Phil Hancock, Mike Mealia of Indiana and JU's Rad Yaun — for second at 141. Anton and Indiana's Bob Jackson are tied for sixth with 142s.

FSU, as a team, shot a 10-under 278 Thursday to overcome East Tennessee State which had taken a six-shot lead after the first day.

Other scores for the Seminoles (the best four count toward the team total) were Kenny Knox with 69-143, Kenny Szuich 70-143, Curley 72-141, Richard Jeffers 73-144 and Terry Anton 72-145.

The 72-hole tournament runs through Saturday.

## Seminoles lead golf

CAPE CORAL — Florida State's golf team saw its lead dwindle to two strokes after the first three rounds of the 12th annual GAC Cape Coral Classic tournament here Friday afternoon.

East Tennessee, which trailed the Seminoles by five strokes going into the third round, managed to cut the lead by three on the windy day. Defending champion Florida is 16 strokes back at 872, followed by Miami and Jacksonville tied at 874.

Curley remained in a tie for second place in the individual competition. His 214 total is three strokes behind Florida's Phil Hancock. Curley is tied with East Tennessee's Olin Callicut.

## FSU golfers hold on to win at Cape Coral

CAPE CORAL — Richard Jeffers fired a three-under-par 69 here Saturday to help the Florida State golf team hold on for an impressive victory in the 19th annual Cape Coral Intercollegiate golf tournament.

The Seminoles finished the four-day tourney with a 1143 total, four strokes ahead of second place East Tennessee State. The Seminoles led East Tennessee by two strokes going into the final round.

Florida was third with an 1160 total, followed by Jacksonville and Miami (1171),

Clemson (1174) and Rollins (1189).

Florida's Phil Hancock won the individual competition with a seven-under-par 281. Indiana's Bob Jackson was next with a 285, followed by Jeffers at 286.

FSU's Terry Anton finished in fifth place with a 287 total. He had a two-under-par 70 in Saturday's final round.

Other golfers for the Seminoles were Kenny Knox (73, 291), Chip Curley (77, 291), Kenny Szuch (75-294), and Tom Anton (77-295).

There were 19 teams from 12 states competing in the tournament.
