HOUSTON — Florida State's golf team, competing in the All-American Intercollegiate Golf Tournament here this week, had a 297 after the first round and stood 15th in a field of 25.

Mark DeBolt of SMU fired a first-round 66 to grab the individual lead and Oklahoma State was the team leader after the first day with a 276 total.

Other first round team scores included: Texas 287; Auburn and Georgia 288; Houston, Texas Tech, Florida, Oklahoma and New Mexico 291; Oregon 293; LSU, Alabama and Texas A&M 294; Arizona 295; Florida State 297; Memphis State and Baylor 303; Missouri and North Texas State 304; Colorado 308.

FSU golfers tie for 12th at Houston

HOUSTON — Florida State was tied for 12th place in the All-America Intercollegiate Invitational Golf Tournament after the second round here Thursday.

The Seminoles stood at 594 and tied with Oklahoma and Louisiana State, and one stroke behind the University of Florida, which was in 11th place with a 593 team score.

Oklahoma State continues to lead with a 561, 33 shots in front of the Seminoles, and nine ahead of secondplace Georgia with a 570 score. Texas is third at 573.

Chip Beck of Georgia leads the individuals with a 36-hole total of 137 after shooting a 69 Thursday.
