Georgia Southern had a team total of 370, followed by Florida International 381, Florida State 384, Jacksonville 387, South Florida 389, South Carolina 394, Georgia Tech 399, Virginia Tech 402, North Carolina-Charlotte 413 and Southern Mississippi 415.

Georgia State's team was late in

arriving and will have to make up the first round in the 54-hole tournament scheduled to end Saturday.

Trailing the trio at 73 in individual scoring were Gary Tinns of Georgia Southern and Mike Johnson of Georgia Tech at 74. Four others were deadlocked at 75—Southern's Ken Kreiger and Gary Duren, South Florida's Doug LaCross and South Carolina's Mike Holland.

Other individual leaders included Mike Holland, South Carolina, 148 and Richard Jeffreys and Chip Curley both of Florida State, 150.
