

FSU golfers in tourney

WINTER HAVEN — Florida State's golf team swings into action this weekend in the first annual Cypress Gardens Invitational. The 17-team infield includes Auburn, Miami and Florida.

Kenny Knox is expected to lead the Seminoles in the 54-hole event that started today. The Tallahasseean has already won four tournaments this year. Other Seminoles competing include snior Buz Wooten, junior Denny Hepler, freshman James Crowley, junior Jim Harrison and senior Rick Fletcher.

"Our squad this year should have good balance," said Coach Don Veller, "I would think that we could have as many as three men below par this season — something we just weren't able to pull off consistently last year. This team could be anywhere from good to outstanding depending on progress."

Palmer, Ga. Southern Lead At Grenelefe

HAINES CITY — North Carolina's Fred Palmer led the individual attack on the golf course at the Grenelefe Golf and Racquet Club with a 69 Friday — but Georgia Southern took the team lead in the Cypress Gardens Intercollegiate Invitational Championship.

Despite winds gusting to 25 miles per hour all day, Palmer made an early charge with five consecutive birdies from holes 2 through 6. He added two other birdies but suffered four bogies in his round on the demanding course that plays to a par 74.

Georgia Southern, last year's Southern independent champion, utilized a steady team effort for its first-round lead in the three-day tournament. Southern was represented by Ken Krieger 72, Steve Waugh 74, Al Fortney 75, Toby Chapin 76, Chip Pellerin 78 and Pat Lynn 83.

The worst round is thrown out in totaling team scores.

Led by Palmer, North Carolina was second at 379. Surprising Rollins was in a tie for third at 387 with Auburn and South Florida. Shooting for Rollins were Scott Cooke 74, Mike Davino 75, Jerry Wall 78, Drew DeVan 79, Mike Nicolette 81 and Stu Titus 82.

Florida State was 11th among the 16 schools at 394, led by Rick Fletcher's 75.

Florida was in a tie for 12th with disappointing Temple, the pre-tourney favorite, at 397. Tom Hagan was tops for the Gators with a 77.

Florida Southern, the tournament host, was 14th with an even 400, as Bob Kramer and Chris Beto both shot 77.
