CAPE CORAL — Florida State's golf team rallied from eight strokes off the pace Friday and took a two-shot lead into today's final round of the 13th annual GAC Cape Coral Intercollegiate golf classic.

The Seminoles, with Kenny Knox and Chip Curley shooting two-underpar 70s, had a team total of 285 for the round and now stand at 864 after three days.

The University of Florida, leader after each of the first two rounds, had a 295 and is two shots back of the Seminoles. Miami is third with an 882 total.

Florida's Sam Traham is the individual leader with a 209 total. He shot even par Friday. Curley is second at 213, Denny Hepler third with 215 and Knox shares fourth at 216.
