Florida State's Kenny Knox and Jim Crawley are one-two after the first day of competition in the State Intercollegiate golf championships in Sebring, but the Seminoles are only second as a team.

Knox and Crawley each had a one-under-par 72 Thursday, helping the Seminoles to a 298 total. That's one stroke behind South Florida.

FSU, under Coach Don Veller, is competing in the last meet for the Seminoles until the main season opens Feb. 10 with the Gator Invitational at Gainesville.

The women's team under Coach Rick Trenary, is at New Port Richie for the Beacon Woods Invitational. Senior Laurie Rusk is playing here last tournament for the Seminoles. After four years as the No. 1 or No. 2 player on the squad, she graduates at the conclusion of this term.

Knox fired a final-day 70 on the windy Sun and Lakes Country Club for a 71-73-70—214 three-day total. Rollins' Craig Cook, who had held the lead through Friday, saw his score shoot up to an 80 Saturday as he ended up with a 220 total.

Other Florida State scores in this final fall tournament were Jim Crowley 71-84-81—236, Steve Bys 78-79-81—238, Dave Boeff 78-86-74—238, Allan Menne 80-81-78—239 and Barry Goodhart 80-81-80—241.
