

'Noles third in golf event

CORAL GABLES — Florida State University's Kenny Knox is second following the first round of the Coral Gables Invitational golf tournament here Wednesday.

Knox had a four-under-par 68, and trails the University of Florida's Greg Olson, who had a 66.

Teamwise, FSU is third in the 19-team tournament with a 286. Florida leads the three-day tourney with a 277. Jacksonville is second at 284. FSU is third, followed by Indiana, which is fourth with a 290 total. Rollins is fifth with a 271 total.

FSU's Grant Turner had a even-par 72, while Dave Boe and Alan Menne both shot 73. Also for the Seminoles, Steve Bys and Steve Fatherbo both shot 77.

The second round of the tourney starts today.

FORT MEYERS — Florida State's Kenny Knox shot an even-par 72 Thursday to hang on to second place halfway through the Cape Coral Intercollegiate golf tournament.

Knox own a 140 total in the 72-hole tourney, one stroke behind Michigan's Doug Davis, who fired a 67 Thursday. FSU stood two strokes out of second place in the team standings, its 580 total trailing Florida's 561 and Jacksonville's 578. Indiana and Miami are tied for fourth at 588.

FORT MEYERS — The Florida State golf team jumped into second place Friday after a strong round under windy conditions in the Cape Coral Intercollegiate golf tournament.

Kenny Knox had some bad luck in falling to a 77 for the day, but still led the FSU team with a 217 with one round to play. Knox is fourth in the individual standings, trailing Flori-

da's Doug Olson who took the lead with a hot 69 for a 210 total.

FSU trails Florida by 20 strokes, the Seminoles coming in at 874. Following are Jacksonville at 879, Miami at 881 and South Florida and Rollins tied at 886.

Boeff paces FSU golfers

CAPE CORAL — Dave Boeff shot a team-low 71 Saturday to key the Florida State golf team's second-place finish in the Cape Coral Intercollegiate golf tournament. Only Florida, with a team total of 1140, bettered FSU's 1170 score.

The Seminoles' top two golfers, Kenny Knox and Grant Turner, did not fare so well in the Cape Coral event, so Boeff and Steve Satterbo picked up the slack. Boeff finished with a four-day total of 289, good enough for fourth place individually in the tournament. Satterbo had a 73-301 while Knox had a 75-292 (seventh place) and Turner an 82-305. Turner's final-round 82 was his high score of the year. Seminole Allen Menne had a 77-298 and teammate Steve Bys a 77-304.

Boeff was a pleasant surprise to FSU coach Dr. Don Veller. Boeff was steady throughout the tournament and always right around par. The first day, Boeff came in with a one-over-par 73, followed by a par 72 and then another one-over 73 before finishing up with his one-under 71.

The Seminoles' next action will be in two weeks when they play in the Chris Schenkel tournament at Georgia Southern.
