

FSU tied with Georgia for lead

STATESBORO, Ga. (UPI) — The University of Georgia's Griff Moody fired a four under par 68 Friday to take the first round individual lead in the Eighth Annual Chris Schenkel Intercollegiate Invitational while Florida State tied with defending champion Georgia for team honors at 291.

Florida State, seeded seventh, got below par rounds from Steve Bys and Kenny Knox, who shot 70 and 71, respectively. Grant Turner added a 74 and Alan Menne a 76 to help FSU.

In the team standings, Wake Forest is in third place at 292, followed by Maryland and South Carolina at 294 and Alabama and East Tennessee at 295.

Knox 2nd, FSU 6th in tourney

STATESBORO, Ga. — Kenny Knox finished second and Florida State sixth in the Chris Schenkel Invitational golf tournament that wound up here Sunday with Wake Forest and Alabama's Gary Trizisonno the winners.

Knox finished the three-day, 54-hole tournament at one-under par 215 after shooting a one-under 71 Sunday to pace the Seminoles in their one-over team performance, finest among the 21 teams on the final day.

The performance shot the Seminoles past Alabama, Kentucky, North Carolina, Mississippi State, Georgia Southern and Memphis State over the final 18 holes and to within one stroke of fifth place.

The Seminoles finished with an 888 team total. Wake won it with a 865, beating out Georgia, which had an 874. Trizisonno of Alabama won the individual title with a five-under 211, four shots better than Knox, who had rounds of 71, 73 and 71 for his 215.

Other FSU players included Steve Bys 70-78-73—221; Grant Turner 74-78-72—224; Allen Menne 76-79-73—228 and Dan Boff 80-74-76—230.

The Seminoles play at Georgia next weekend.

Seminoles' Knox sixth in Schenkel

STATESBORO, Ga. — Florida State University's Kenny Knox shot a one-over-par 73 here Saturday, and is now in sixth place in the Chris Schenkel Invitational golf tournament. Knox has a 144 two-day total.

FSU is 10th in the 21-team field with a 598 total. The final 18 holes of the tournament will be played today.

Knox is five strokes out of first place, and two strokes out of second. Gary Trizosanno of the University of Alabama is first in the individual standings with a 139 total, while Wake Forest leads the team standings with a 581 mark.

Other FSU scores Saturday included: Dave Boss, 74-154; Steve Bys, 78-148; Grant Turner, 78-152; and Alan Menne, 79-155.
