CYPRESS GARDENS — Florida State slipped to eighth and Allan Menne to a tie for fifth in the Cypress Gardens Intercollegiate Invitational golf tournament Saturday.

Menne, who was third after an opening day 72, shot a two-over-par 74 Saturday for a 36-hole score of 146.

The Seminoles, fifth after the first round, stood eighth with a 760 total, just 10 shots out of third place.

Florida continued to lead with a two-day total of 720, 16 strokes better than North Carolina State with a 730. Ohio State and Oral Roberts were tied for third at 740.

Jim Crowley had the Seminoles' second best round Saturday, a three-over-par 75 on the long, narrow 7,-100-yard Grenelefe County Club course. It left him at 156 for the tournament that winds up today.

Other Seminoles included Paul Downes 75-78-153, Dave Boeff 77-77-154, Scott Perry 77-78-155 and

Steve Hart 78-77-155.

Florida wins Cypress

CYPRESS GARDENS — The University of Florida took the lead on the first day and went on to win the Third Annual Cypress Gardens Intercollegiate Invitational golf tournament Sunday.

Florida State finished eighth in the 18-team event. Allen Menne was the top Seminole golfer with a 78-224 for 15th individually. Other FSU scores: Paul Downes 74-227, Steve Hart 75-230, Scott Perry 78-233, Dave Beoff 80-234 and Jim Crowley 78-234.

The Gators finished with a 1,105 team total, 18 shots better than second-place Oral Roberts at 1,123. Third place went to Ohio State Uni-

versity, with 1,125; North Carolina State finished fourth at 1,126 and defending champion Georgia Southern finished fifth at 1,130.

Todd Smith, a junior from North Carolina State, had seven birdies, one bogey and one double bogey for the three-day tournament and captured top individual honors with a 4-underpar 68 Sunday and 211 overall. He broke the tournament record by five strokes.

Second place went to Terry Anton of Florida. He finished with a 70 Sunday for a 216 total. Jodie Mudd of Georgia Southern, Gary Halberg of Wake Forest and Joe Findelar of Ohio State were ded at 217.
