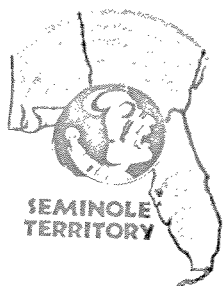

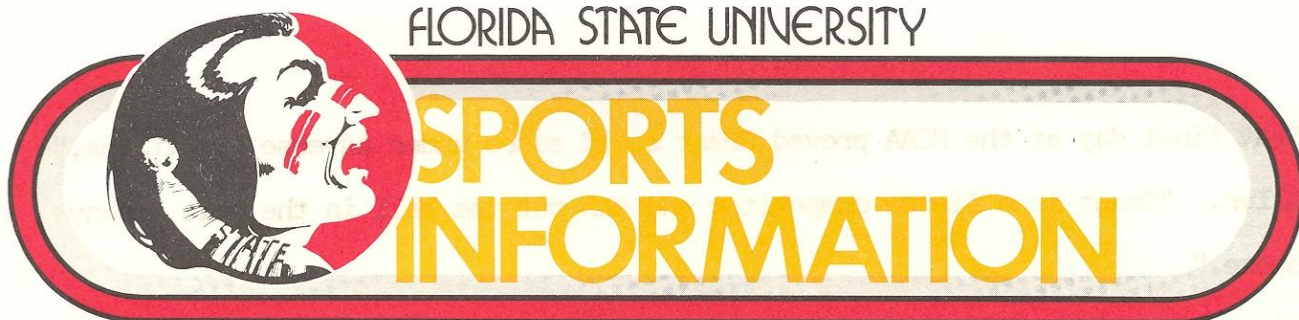

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.--Only a sophomore, Florida State golfer Grant Turner has been selected for third team All-American honors following his 12th place performance in this year's NCAA Championships.

"This has to be the biggest honor in the last ten years for anyone on our team," said Seminole head coach Don Veller. "Grant is certainly our most valuable player."

Hailing from London, England, Turner has been one of the Seminoles' top golfers all spring, capturing second in the prestigious Chris Schenkel Invitational and tying for first in the Metro Conference Championships before falling to second on the first hole of sudden death.

This season, the Englander has averaged slightly over 73 strokes per round and has helped the Tribe linksmen capture three championships prior to the NCAA meet.

Prior to his NCAA selection, Turner was the Belgian Amateur Champion, French Junior Champion and a qualifier for the British Open. With his NCAA berth this season, Turner receives an automatic bid to compete in an All-Star Tournament to be staged with this year's Sun Bowl festivities. Turner was also selected as the first alternate for the American collegiate team that will be touring Japan this summer.

In the NCAA, Turner started slowly, but quickly found his game and passed several top golfers the final day. On that final day, with pouring rains and gail-force winds, Turner carded a 76 one of the lowest rounds of the tournament.

"That final day at the NCAA proved Grant could score under adverse conditions," said Veller. "Grant is a fierce competitor and can put the ball in the hole on any golf course."

This summer, Turner plans on playing in the prestigious Porter Cup in New York, the New England Amateau in Providence, RI, and the Sunnihanna Invitational in Pennsylvania. Following those tournaments, Turner plans to return to England where he hopes to qualify for the British Open.
