MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Florida State's golf team finished third Sunday in the 54-hole Southeastern Intercollegiate golf tournament at Rolling Hills.

Tennessee, in second place after the first two rounds, shot a seven-over-par 295 Sunday to win the team title, edging South Carolina by two shots.

Tennessee's winning total was 889 in the 21-team field.
The Volunteers had trailed the Gamecocks by two shots after the second round.

South Carolina's Steve Leibler won the individual title with a three-under-par 213. Liebler had Sunday's low round at 68.

Mike Domalske of Florida Southern was second at 218. Tennessee's Stuart Smith, Ole Miss' Greg Williams and Clemson's Clarence Rose finished in a three-way tie for third at 220.

Julian Taylor of Clemson and Florida State's Grant Turner tied for sixth at 221. Lee Rinker of Alabama and Kevin Janiga of Tennessee shared eighth place at 222.

Also for Florida State, Stephen Keppler and Paul Downes were at 226, Mike grant at 228 and Marcus Beck at 229.
