

FSU men golfers in 12th place

The Florida State men's golf team is in 12th place after two rounds of play in the Jim Corbett-LSU Invitational at Baton Rouge, La. The final round will be played today.

Centenary College leads the tourney which includes 10 of the nation's top 15 teams of a year ago. Florida is in second place, while defending national champion Oklahoma State is tied for seventh.

Leading the way for FSU (which finished 14th in the nation last year) is Paul Azinger, with a three over par total of 147. Azinger was tied for sixth individually after Wednesday's opening round, with a two-under round of 70. But a 10-stroke fourth hole Thursday, followed by a double-bogey fifth hole, dropped him back. The other Seminoles playing include Stephen Keppler (a two-round total of 147), Paul Downes (148), Grant Turner (149) and Mike Grant (153).

The individual leader of the tournament is Oral Roberts' Joe Rasett with a 136 total.

"We're having first tournament jitters," said FSU coach Don Veller. "But we expect to do better tomorrow."

FSU men golfers finish in 10th

BATON ROUGE — The Florida State men's golf team rose from 12th to finish 10th Friday in the Jim Corbett-LSU Invitational. The tourney was won by Oral Roberts, who also had the top individual finisher, Joe Rasett.

Tying for FSU individual honors were Stephen Keppler and Paul Azinger, who both had three-round totals of 218 to finish 12 strokes behind Rasett. Other FSU golfers included Paul Downes (with a 222 total), Grant Turner (224) and Mike Grant (225).

Florida, which was in seventh place after two rounds, finished in fourth.

FSU's next competes in the Greenleaf-Cypress Gardens Tournament in two weeks.
