

FSU golfers lead in tourney

CYPRESS GARDENS — The Florida State men's golf team is in first place after one round of play in the Greneleaf-Andy Bean intercollegiate golf tournament.

FSU leads with a 289 total, one stroke ahead of North Carolina (290). Tennessee and Ohio State are tied for third (293) with Miami (294) in fifth place.

Individually, FSU's Grant Turner is in second place with a three-under par 69. Ohio State's Chris Terry leads the tourney with a 68 total. Not far back are FSU golfers Stephen Keppler (71), Paul Azinger (75), Paul Downes (75) and Mike Grant (78).

The three-round tournament continues through Sunday.

Seminole golfers take second

The FSU men's golf team surged from fifth place Saturday to finish second Sunday by one stroke to Ohio State in the Greneleaf-Andy Bean Classic held in Haines City.

Ohio State took the team title with a 906 score while FSU and North Carolina tied for second at 907. The Seminoles were awarded second place because their fifth man finished higher than the Tar Heels' fifth man.

North Carolina's Steve Leibler won the individual title with a three-round score of 221 but he was closely followed by FSU's Steven Kepler who shot a 222. Seminole senior Grant Turner was third at 223, and FSU's Paul Downes finished at 232. Fourth and fifth men for FSU were Paul Azinger and Mike Grant who each shot 236s.

FSU golfers trip to fifth

CYPRESS GARDENS — Bedeviled by late-afternoon winds, the Florida State men's golf team slipped to fifth place after Saturday's second round of the Greneleaf-Andy Bean intercollegiate golf tournament.

The University of North Carolina, with a two-day total of 590, holds a three-stroke lead over Ohio State going into today's final round. Miami is third at 596, followed by Tennessee at 598 and FSU at 599. The University of Florida is 11th with a 612 total.

Florida State's Grant Turner faded to a 77 after an opening-round 69, but his 146 total was good for fourth place, two strokes off the lead. Steve Keppler of the Seminoles was ninth at 71-78—149. Other FSU scores include Paul Downes, 75-76—151; Paul Azinger 74-79—154; and Mike Grant 78-79—157.
